THE THEATRE

- I am going to Casa Mañana Theatre to see the play Junie B. Jones is Not a Crook.



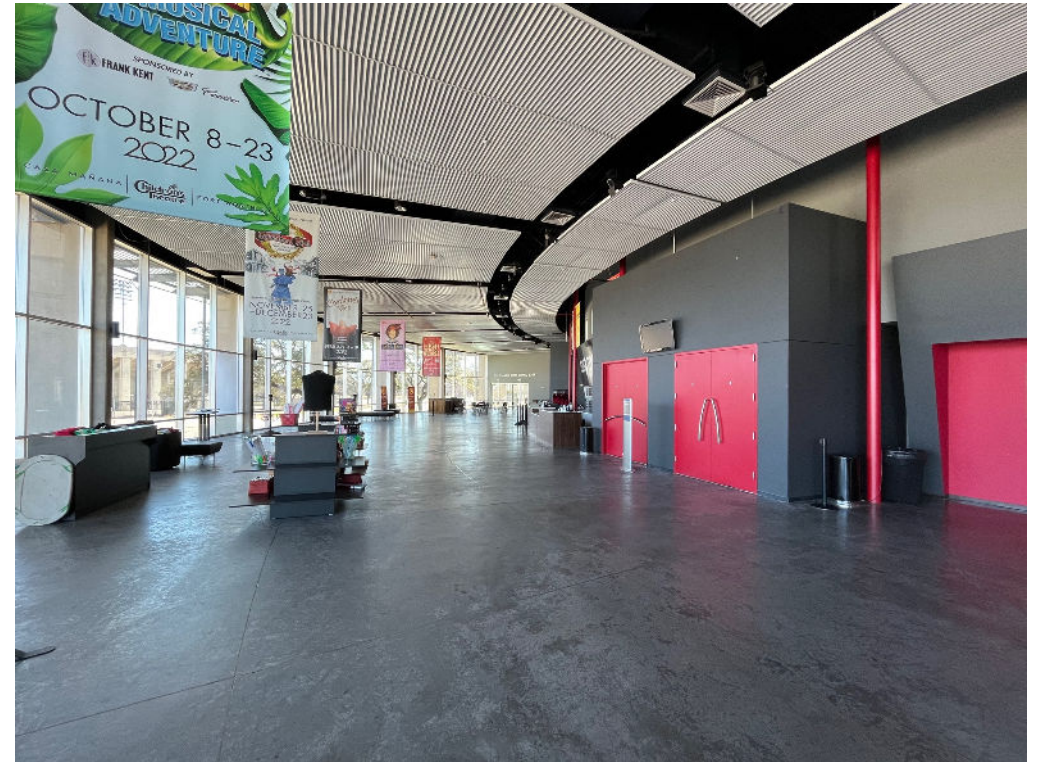
PARKING

- When we arrive at Casa Mañana Theatre, we will park our car in the parking lot.

ENTERING THE LOBBY

CONCESSION STANDS

- In the lobby I will see the concession stand.
- Concession stands are for people to purchase drinks and snacks.



MERCHANDISE STAND

- In the lobby I will also see the merchandise stand. This stand sells t-shirts and toys.



THEATRE USHERS

- The theatre ushers are friendly helpers.
- When it is time to go into the theatre, an usher in a red vest will scan my ticket.
- If we need help finding our seats, we can ask an usher can help us.



INSIDE THE THEATRE

- Casa Mañana has a special ceiling. I can look up at it and see how shiny it is.



MY SEAT

- My ticket will show my assigned seat.
- During the show, I will sit with my family. There may be some people I don't know sitting near me.



THE PLAY

- During the play, I will see the actors on the stage.
- Halfway through the show the actors will leave the stage for intermission. Intermission is a break during the play. It lasts 20 minutes. My family and I can stay in our seats or go back into the lobby.



BATHROOMS

- I will let the people I am with know if I need to use to the bathroom.
- The nearest bathroom is in the lobby.
- I can ask an usher for directions.



LOBBY AND CABARET ROOM

- If I need a break from the show, I can go back into the lobby or the quiet space in the cabaret room. An usher can help me find where to go.



CLAPPING

- At the end of the show, the actors will bow, and the audience will clap. If I like the show, I can clap too. If the clapping is too loud, I can cover my ears.



AFTER THE PLAY

- When the play is over, people will leave their seats in the theatre at the same time. The aisles and grand lobby may be crowded as we leave to go to our car.
