OUR HISTORY

In 1936, Amon G. Carter began making plans for the large amphitheater known Casa Mañana. In 1958, Casa Mañana Theatre was completed as the famous aluminum-domed theatre known today. Arts programming was expanded in 1962 when Casa Mañana's Theatre School opened to train children in the performing arts. After more than 55 years in operation, Casa Mañana School for Musical Theatre is a nationally recognized program. The studio is listed first in regional theatre training programs for young performers by backstage.com. The studios operate year-round with fall and spring sessions, Camp Casa, Camp Casa Jr, and Apprentice Program.

Casa Mañana School for Musical Theatre combines over a half century of educational theatre experience with the standards of a professional Equity theatre to give all students an opportunity to grow and learn within one of the most recognized theatres in the Southwest. Casa Mañana was first in theatrical training in the DFW area and remains a premiere program for young artists today.

Please plan to escort your child into the Studio building (gray one-story building behind the dome) for check-in on the first day of camp. Do NOT drop them off.

**Late pick-up fees will be assessed for students who are not picked up by 5:15 PM. PLEASE ONLY DROP OFF AND PICK UP YOUR CAMPERS AT THE TIMES GIVEN. Families who repeatedly disregard Pick Up/Drop Off procedures are in violation of our studio expectations. In such circumstances, Casa Mañana reserves the right to remove such families from the program, and no refund will be issued.

CASA MAÑANA SAFETY PROCEDURES

CASA MAÑANA SCHOOL FOR MUSICAL THEATRE SAFETY POLICY

- All CM Studio instructors and staff have been subject to a background check and training.
- o **CM Studio doors will be locked during camp and class time**. The studio door will only be unlocked during pick up and drop off.
- o Campers will only be released to authorized adults, designated at registration.
- No unauthorized people will be in the studios at any time.

- o Please alert us to any changes to your camper requirements as soon as able.

Payments & Payment Plans

- We accept Master Card, Visa, American Express, Discover, or Check (made out to Casa Mañana Inc.). There is a \$25.00 fee for returned checks.
- For your convenience, we also offer payment plans by calling the Education Office at 817-321-5040. Payment plans are not available online.
- o Tuition is due in full at the time of registration or can be divided into payment. The payment plan includes the \$25.00 non-refundable registration fee and is only available for those paying with a credit/debit card.
- All tuition must be paid in full by June 1, 2026 for High School Camp, Grease, Camp Casa: Matilda Jr and Camp Jr.

Refunds

- Camp Casa and Camp Casa: High School: The \$25 registration fee is non-refundable. You may cancel your registration up until 5pm on April 24, 2026, and receive a refund of funds paid, less the \$25 registration fee. If you cancel your registration AFTER 5pm on April 24, 2026, no refunds will be offered unless we are able to register someone from the waitlist to fill your spot.
- o If you enroll in a payment plan and choose to cancel, **your remaining balance is still due according to your payment plan and the refund policy.**

Absences

No child will be penalized for missing camp due to illness. For the health and safety of our staff and students, please do not come to class if you are unwell. If you have a camp conflict, please notify the Education Office as soon as possible by emailing them at education@casamanana.org. For the performance, numerous absences may result in diminished participation in the performance.

Camp Expectations

- There will be <u>no cell phones or any other electronic distractions</u> while at camp. Keep them in your bag. Phones are <u>NOT</u> allowed during rehearsal or class. They will be taken up if we see the cell phone and given back at the end of the day. Phones will be allowed during lunch.
- There will be no inappropriate language, hate speech, or gestures while at camp.
- o There will be no eating or CHEWING GUM during camp.
- O NO NUTS OF ANY KIND ALLOWED!
- Only waters bottles or <u>cups with a lid</u> are permitted in the studio or the theatre. Please bring your own water bottle, we do not have any extra cups for water.
- All personal items are personal responsibility and should be stored safely during class time. Casa Mañana is not responsible for any lost or misplaced items. Camp Casa reserves the right to confiscate any items which cause disruptions.

Camp Dress Expectations

- o Closed-toe shoes are required. NO SANDALS or SLIP-ON SHOES.
- o Students need to have clothes that are comfortable to move in, while not prohibitive for stretching.
- Hair to be pulled back away from face.
- o No jewelry.

Behavior Expectations

The well-being of our staff, students, and families is the heart of Casa Mañana School for Musical Theatre. All of us have the right to feel secure in a learning environment. It is expected that those in the studio will engage with others in a safe and respectful manner. With that in mind, Casa Mañana reserves the right to remove students who violate studio expectations from class or camp at any time. In extreme cases, parents will be contacted immediately to retrieve their child. If the behavior continues, the student will not be permitted to return to the studios and no refund will be issued.

Snacks/Food Allergies:

Campers will provide their own lunches and snack items for 2 snack periods.

Do NOT bring any NUTS OF ANY KIND! Please, alert us to any food allergies your camper may have.

Campers Check List

- All campers must bring <u>CLEARLY LABELED</u> lunches and snack items for 2 snack periods.
 - Lunches must be ready to eat, we do not have a microwave, and you may **not** bring your student an
 outside lunch and you may **not** leave to go get lunch.
- o A reusable water bottle with your name on it.
- A pencil (more than one preferred!)
- o Please make sure that all your items are clearly LABELED with your camper's NAME.

CAMP CASA: HIGH SCHOOL 2026 AUDITIONS

(Trust us, you are going to SHINE!)

Auditions will be held on the first day of camp on **Monday, June 8**, all young performers will audition for a role in the production of *Grease, School Edition*. This is a low-stake process to determine student expectations, abilities, and ensemble building. **AUDITIONING IS A VITAL PART OF THE PERFORMANCE PROCESS!** That said, we understand stage fright can strike no matter the level of experience. Please know Camp Casa: High School strives to make this a fun experience, even for those campers who have never done it before! *And don't forget!* Everyone who is enrolled in the camp will perform in the show. So, relax and have fun — you've already been cast!

The Process

- o The audition will be broken up into three parts: Acting, Singing and Dance.
- The acting portion will be cold reads from the script.
- o For their singing audition, campers will be provided a song one week prior to the first day of camp.
- o For their dance audition, campers will be provided a dance video one week prior to the first day of camp. The choreographer will also go over the dance before the audition begins.
- Please wear dance clothes to this audition. Closed-toe shoes are imperative. <u>NO SANDALS, CROCS, SLIP ON</u> SHOES OR FLIP FLOPS.

Helpful Audition Tips

- Familiarize yourself ahead of time with the show- even though there's a role for everyone at Camp Casa: High School! That said, casting a show is about building an ensemble. The size or name of a part isn't what's important, it's the team involved. A show works best when everyone works together.
- Wear something that flatters you and that you can move well in. Please do not dress in a costume or "Picture Day Best" as these items may not be the best option for the movement/dance portion of the audition.
- o State your name loudly and clearly before you begin your audition. (This is called a "slate", or "slating" your name.)
- Be your best advocate! Let the production team know if something makes you uncomfortable, or there are elements you are unsure about. Auditionees can say "no" at any time. We still may ask to you move or speak- just at the level you are comfortable with.

Casting

- We will announce the cast list no later than the second day of camp.
- Each camper will receive a copy of the script that is theirs to keep. Additional scripts are \$10. Please remind your
 camper to bring their scripts with them to camp EVERY DAY!

My camper didn't get the part they wanted, now what?


Hey, it happens. View it as a learning experience, and remember what you get out is what you put in. How much fun your camper will have during a performance isn't determined by their role but by their attitude. And there's always another show!

Please do not email the education staff or the directing team about casting. Please respect the decision of the directing team and the students who have been cast.



PICK UP/DROP OFF: ROUTE & PROCEDURES

For the safety of our campers, please adhere to these pick-up and drop-off procedures.



Pick-up / Drop-off

Parking is NOT permitted anywhere except for the main parkinglot. Please do not blocktraffic by waiting in the fire lanes of the driveway.

Drop-Off

- o Please ignore Google Maps. Always enter from W. Lancaster Avenue into the parking lot.
- Drive through the main parking lot for drop off at the Rehearsal Studios behind the dome.
- Exit from Casa Mañana onto University Dr.
- o You can return to the parking lot by exiting onto University and then turning back on Lancaster.
- Staff will be outside the studio/theater to direct students. You may park in the main parking lot and walk your student to the studio doors.
- o **DO NOT EVER PARK IN ANY NAMED SPOTS, FIRE LINES OR IN FRONT OF THE STUDIOS** or on the left side of the street between the dome and rehearsal studio, as these are reserved for staff, or are fire lanes.

Pick-Up

- As we have many cars picking up at one time, we ask for your patience and that you please use caution. The pickup line is usually completed in 10-15 minutes.
- **Enter from W Lancaster Ave.** Turn immediately towards the **left side** of the parking lot and make two lines to enter the circle drive from the left side of the parking lot.
- o You will receive dashboard name tags when you check in on Day 1. Please have them on your car every day.
- Please exit onto University Drive. Exiting cars should form 2 Lanes of traffic to turn LEFT or RIGHT onto University
- o Parents and/or guardians are asked **to remain by their vehicles at all times** to help campers in/out of their car. A staff member will be waiting to receive campers as they are dropped off.
- If you would prefer not to use our carpool lane, we ask that you please park in the main parking lot to accompany your camper(s) to and from the door. This prevents us from blocking traffic and slowing down our carpool lane.

Code of Conduct Agreement

IF YOU DID NOT REGISTER ONLINE, PLEASE FILL OUT AND RETURN THIS FORM TO THE EDUCATION OFFICE ON/BEFORE THE FIRST DAY OF CAMP.

This is the Code of Behavior for campers to follow during camp. Self-discipline is a necessary part of the Camp Casa experience. An inability to work within these simple guidelines may result in a conference with the Education Department, possible parent conference, and, in extreme circumstances, dismissal from camp. We are here to have fun and to learn. We take the process to put on a production very seriously and expect the same from our campers. This contract must be signed and dated by both the camper and a parent or guardian and turned in by the first day of camp.

- 1. **Camper will attend all required rehearsals**. Failure to attend rehearsals for any reasons other than illness, family emergency or pre-camp arrangement PRIOR to the first day of camp with the Education Department may prevent participation in the final production. This is at the discretion of the Education Department and Directing team.
- 2. Camper will treat the camp staff, fellow campers, and themselves with respect and dignity always.
- 3. Camper will not use any cell phones, iPods, electronic games, or any other electronic distractions during rehearsal time. Campers will have access to a phone in special circumstances and emergencies.
- 4. Camper will participate in a positive manner during all camp activities.
- 5. Camper will not leave the camp premises during camp hours, unless cleared with the Education Department.
- 6. Camper will be responsible for checking in and out with counselors daily.
- 7. Camper will refrain from using inappropriate language and gestures during camp.
- 8. Camper will not eat or chew gum during classes or rehearsals.
- 9. Camper will be responsible for all personal items that they bring with them to camp each day.
- 10. **BONUS RULE!** Campers will benefit from the experience of qualified and professional directors and instructors, will make new friends, and have a great time!
